RE: ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES MONTHLY REPORT - JULY & AUGUST 2014

#### ENVIRONMENTAL PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT:

#### REEP - Realtor Energy Efficiency Program

- Training Manual for Certified Energy Assessors to run REALTOR training programs drafted.
- Six training sessions held with REALTORS in Nanaimo (3), Lantzville, Courtney and Ladysmith.
- Marketing tools being currently prepared for VIREB website.
- Database for home energy upgrade case studies for Nanaimo is currently being prepared.
   Data for the case studies is being requested and includes home energy audit results and how and what home improvements were made as a result of the audit. Where possible, home energy consumption information will be included.

#### Development Application Review & Development Referrals

- Attended two pre-application meetings to review initial development proposals with developers.
- Reviewed and provided comment on four referrals.
- Met with a developer to discuss environmental compensation options, as part of a rezoning application being researched.

#### MEETINGS / TRAINING / PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT:

- Rainwater management policy review team meeting held. Engineering staff will draft policy and procedures for the Engineering Standards and Specifications based on discussions and report back to the review team in the fall.
- Green Lake Water Quality Testing began in August. The testing involved 5 tests conducted at 7 perimeter sites, once per week for three weeks. Tests also scheduled for after the fall flush (Late October)
- Inventory of Knotweed Sites in the Brechan Hill Neighborhood Conducted. Inventor results being placed on the provincial IAPP database.
- Met with members of the staff Green Group at SARC to discuss next steps to expand green initiatives for City employees. Also discussed how expanded recycling can be completed for City buildings.

#### **ENFORCEMENT:**

- Environmental Enforcement Protocol to determine how environmental bylaw infractions are to be handled between departments completed.
- Attended Committee of the Whole meeting to respond to questions on a staff environmental bylaw enforcement report in regards to tree removal.
- Met with staff to review enforcement matters for two properties.
- Worked on developing course materials for the Beaver Management instruction that will be given to City of Nanaimo staff.
- 14 Calls for Service in July and 9 Calls for Service in August.

#### PARKS OPERATIONS (JUNE 2014):

- The annual update of the park and trail maps has been completed. Publications have been printed and are being distributed to all City of Nanaimo facilities.
- We are very pleased to be a host employer to the Employability Skill Development and Work Experience Initiative Program run from the Nanaimo Foodshare Agency. The candidate that we are mentoring is a local unemployed single mother with no marketable job skills.
- Adjustments have been made to the street planters program to make the program more environmentally sustainable and cost effective. The new program will reduce water consumption, fuels used in maintenance, and reduce fertilizer use. The original program was created to enhance streetscapes where there was no color or greenery. Our downtown has changed significantly over the past few years. Improvements to Diana Krall Plaza and the addition of landscaping at the Conference Centre, McGregor Park, and Port Place Shopping Centre have brought in vibrant planting in the downtown. Places where street planters used to be placed were being are being taken over by the expansion of the tree wells as the downtown trees grew. We have removed 53 street planters from the downtown which have been sold through BCBID.
