Grants & Exemptions 2014-FEB-27

What are Grants?

- Payments to organizations (mostly nonprofit) or exemption from a fee or tax;
- Usually results (directly or indirectly) in a service to the public;
 - Arguable whether some of these are actually "fees for service" instead of grants
- A very small amount is direct to the public (e.g. toilet rebates);

Operating Grants

- The largest \$ value of cash grants,
- Most fall into the "fee for service" category,
- Generally have a specific line within the City budget,
- No annual application process,
- Have been added over the years, with approval, sometimes direction, of Council,
- Some are fixed, some get inflationary increases.

Social Grants

- Social development grants:
 - Funded from Casino revenue (\$90k)
 - Calls for proposals for specific areas of interest
 - 2013 was for Loaves & Fishes (refrigerated truck \$60k)
 - SPAC makes recommendation to Council
- Community Services grants:
 - 2 intakes each year (total \$25k)
 - Calls for proposals for specific areas
 - SPAC makes recommendations to Council
- Housing Legacy Fund:
 - Current balance is about \$2.6 million
 - Used to provide municipal support to affordable housing initiatives (e.g. Pacifica Housing)
 - Approved by Council

Social Grants

- Flow through grants:
 - UBCM application based often used for consultants rather than cash grants
 - VIHA e.g. homelessness, 1st Unitarian
 - Healthy Communities could be flow through or project related
 - RDN potential flow through for regional projects

Amenity contributions:

- Often involved in finding projects for amenity contributions
- Approved by Council
- E.g., United Way (\$60k)
- Miscellaneous
 - Rent subsidy for 7/10 Club Council

Recreation & Sports

- Sport Tournament Grants (\$21k)
 - Recreation Committee recommends to PRC Commission to Council
- VIP Parks program (\$100k)
 - Parks Committee recommends to PRC Commission
 - Usually City pays supplier invoices instead of cash grant
- Travel Grants (\$7.5k)
 - Not limited to Recreation & Sport)
 - PRC Commission recommends to Council
- Knowles Estate (Reserve balance \$439k)
 - PRC Commission recommends to Council

Cultural Grants

- Arts & Cultural Events (\$25k)
 - Cultural Committee makes recommendations to Council
 - Used to leverage senior govt. funding
- Cultural Operating Grants (\$211k)
 - \$2.25 per capita
 - Cultural Committee makes recommendations to Council
 - Used to leverage senior govt. funding
- Direct appeal to Council:
 - E.g., in 2013, Council gave a grant to Nanaimo Theatre Group equal to DCCs paid (\$9,700)

Cultural Grants – Heritage

- Heritage Façade Grants (\$20k)
 - Provide funding for rehab of exteriors of heritage buildings in the downtown core
 - Heritage Commission makes recommendations to Council
- Residential Heritage grants (\$12k)
 - Provide funding for rehab of exteriors of heritage homes listed on the heritage register
 - Approved by Heritage Commission based on previous Council direction

Other Grants

- Grants Advisory Committee has a budget for grants that don't fit anywhere else (\$7k)
 - E.g., rental subsidy for volunteer banquet
 - GAC makes recommendations to Council
- PTE Cash Grants (\$5k)
 - Used only in unusual circumstances
 - GAC makes recommendations to Council
- Security Check Grants (\$2k)
- Direct appeals to Council
 - E.g, BCSPCA SNIP program \$25k
 - Funded from Council contingency

PTEs – Revenue policy

- "The City of Nanaimo believes that Permissive Tax Exemptions are an appropriate way to recognize the value of the services provided to the community by non-profit organizations.
- Permissive Tax Exemption requests will be reviewed by the Grants Advisory Committee based on policies and guidelines approved by Council. The Committee will make recommendations to Council.
- Permissive Tax Exemptions will be reviewed at least every three years to ensure that the organization and property still meets the criteria established by Council."

Revitalization Tax Exemptions

- "The City of Nanaimo believes that Revitalization Tax Exemptions are an appropriate tool to assist the City in realizing its strategic objectives."
- The City can exempt municipal taxes for up to ten years for projects undertaken by landowners, where the project meets defined objectives of a City strategy.
- Recipients of exemptions must enter into a Revitalization Tax Exemption Agreement with the City.
- Every Revitalization Tax Exemption must be approved by Council.

Less than Market Leases & Licences

- 31 nominal leases & licences to various non profits/community organizations
- Examples: Supportive Housing, Museum, 150 Commercial, Buccaneers etc
- Total annual rent forgone \$2,234,160.
- Largest rents not collected are:
 - Port Theatre: \$1,103,820
 - Nanaimo District Museum \$265,220
 - McGirr Sports Field Society: \$297,240
- Does not reflect actual market value

Less than Market Leases & Licences

Leases

- Deemed disposition of property
- Approved by Council
- Notice to taxpayers

Licences

- Not exclusive
- Transfer limited rights
- Usually a short cancellation period
- Used frequently by PRE, Culture
