Arts Alive Summer School 2011

I am now in a position to report on our Summer School, which ran from July 11 to July 29, and which was made possible in part by your generous grant.

Firstly, I enclose a copy of the brochure/flyer, which was published in the local newspaper in April and June. This has been the main avenue for disseminating information about our classes, and is also used for registrations at Parks Recreation and Culture facilities. All the information was also available on our web site. This year showed a disappointing reduction in numbers of registrations, and we had around 260 participants sign up for the courses. Although this led to cancellation of some classes, nearly 20 instructors held approaching 40 successful classes in art, music, dance and drama, for children and adults, as well as weekly day camps.

The reasons behind this reduction in numbers has been considered by the Board, and they believe that it is partly due to the adverse financial situation, but also possibly because Arts Alive needs to review how it gets the word out; newspaper flyers may not be the right medium in 2012! As a result we are conducting a full review, and have also decided to update our web site, which is looking pretty "old fashioned" now.

Luckily, we were able to come away from the year with only a small deficit, and thanks to small surpluses in previous years having been placed in reserves, against expectations of difficulties such as this, we have every intention with forging ahead with our next Summer School in July 2012.

For your information, I also enclose a copy of the "thank you" advertisement published in the local newspaper. In addition, your contribution to Arts Alive was acknowledged by signage on site at the Summer School. On behalf of the Board, I should like to thank the City of Nanaimo both for your generous grant, and also the other assistance you afford to our operations..
