# 1. CALL THE OPEN MEETING TO ORDER:

The Regular Meeting was called to order at 7:02 p.m.

# 2. INTRODUCTION OF LATE ITEMS:

3. ADOPTION OF AGENDA:

It was moved and seconded that the Staff presentation, Item 5.(a), be moved to later in the Agenda to allow Commission to hear from the Forest Drive Park delegation and then go "In Camera" to deal with "In Camera" matters before proceeding with the remainder of the regular and "In Camera" agendas. The motion carried unanimously.

It was moved and seconded that the Agenda, as amended, be adopted. The motion carried unanimously.

# 4. <u>ADOPTION OF MINUTES:</u>

(a) Minutes of the Regular Parks, Recreation and Culture Commission Meeting held Wednesday, 2011-JUL-27 at 7:01 p.m. in the Bowen Park Complex Conference Room.

It was moved and seconded that the Minutes be adopted as circulated. The motion carried unanimously.

### 5. <u>PRESENTATIONS:</u> (deferred to later in Agenda)

#### (a) Changing Face of Events & Festivals - Elizabeth Williams, Manager, Recreation & Culture Services.

#### 6. <u>DELEGATIONS:</u>

It was moved and seconded that the Delegations be permitted to address the Commission. The motion carried unanimously.

(a) Ms. Shawna Drinnan, presenting on behalf of Mr. Michael Sloan, 2031 Forest Drive, Nanaimo, BC, V9S 2R6, representing the Forest Drive Park VIP group, requesting that the Parks, Recreation and Culture Commission approve and provide funding for the upgrade of the existing Forest Drive Tot-Lot to accommodate the entire community neighbourhood.

Ms. Drinnan provided a powerpoint presentation on Forest Drive Park where it is located, and what their hopes are to upgrade it from its current state to present day standards. The playground equipment is outdated and the delegation would like to upgrade it. Consultation with neighbours has taken place. There was a meeting held in July and there was a lot of interest in both a community garden and in the playground. They would like the playground layout to be purpose driven to include different age areas as well as a pathway to accommodate through pedestrian traffic. They would also like to have a paved trail around the perimeters of the areas to accommodate pedestrian wheeled traffic, such as tricycles, wheelchairs, and baby strollers.

There has historically been an issue with water run off and Phase I would improve drainage. The group has reviewed a few different layout plans to accommodate increasing community garden plots as interest increases. Much of the information and interest has been by word of mouth; however, recently a Facebook page has been created. There are a number of teenagers in the area, and to provide something for their interest and activity a half-court is shown in the plans.

It was moved and seconded that the delegation be received. The motion carried unanimously.

It was moved and seconded that the Parks, Recreation and Culture Commission meeting move "In-Camera". The motion carried unanimously.

Commission moved "In Camera" at 7:15 p.m. and returned to their regular open meeting at 7:29 p.m.

# 7. <u>CHAIR'S REPORT</u>:

(a) Blues Festival Society - follow-up on a very successful event.

It was moved and seconded that the Parks, Recreation and Culture Commission send a letter of congratulations to the Blues Festival Society. The motion carried unanimously.

(b) Opening of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Artificial Turf Field.

It was a very well done event and staff are to be congratulated.

It was moved and seconded that the Parks, Recreation and Culture Commission send a letter of thanks and congratulations to Staff for the highly successful 2nd Artificial Turf Field opening. The motion carried unanimously.

  - (i) <u>Poet Laureate for Nanaimo.</u>

<u>Cultural Committee's Recommendation:</u> That the Parks, Recreation and Culture Commission recommend that Council approve the establishment of a Poet Laureate program for Nanaimo, and that \$1,000 be budgeted for annual expenses for the Poet Laureate beginning in 2012.

Commission wished to make a friendly amendment to the motion to add "for a trial period of three years", with the motion now reading as:

It was moved and seconded that the Parks, Recreation and Culture Commission recommend that Council approve the establishment of a Poet Laureate program, for a trial period of three years, for Nanaimo, and that \$1,000 be budgeted for annual expenses for the Poet Laureate beginning in 2012. The motion carried unanimously.

- (d) <u>Grants Advisory Committee.</u> Commissioner Avis reported on the meetings held since 2011-JUL-27. Attended a meeting of the Committee of the Whole in early September and for the most part Council agreed with the recommendations. Also attended a meeting today for review a small number of applications.

- (f) <u>Social Planning Advisory Committee.</u> Deferred to October PRCC meeting.
- (g) <u>Port Theatre.</u> Monthly report for July and August, 2011.

- (i) <u>Nanaimo District Museum.</u> Monthly report for July and August, 2011. Commissioner Lance that on Saturday there was a very successful Sports Hall of Fame induction.

It was moved and seconded that the Advisory Body reports be received. The motion carried unanimously.

### 9. <u>STAFF REPORTS:</u>

### (a) Smoke Free Parks, Beaches and Facilities.

<u>Staff Recommendation:</u> That the Parks, Recreation and Culture Commission: recommend that Council direct Staff to draft an amendment to the Parks, Recreation and Culture Regulation Bylaw 2008 No. 7073 which expands the City of Nanaimo smoke-free zones to include all City managed recreation properties including: trails, plazas, parks, beaches, and recreation facilities; except in designated smoking areas as required.

It was moved and seconded that the recommendation be adopted. The motion carried unanimously.

### (b) Maffeo Sutton Planning Update.

<u>Staff's Recommendations:</u> That the Parks, Recreation and Culture Commission recommend to Council that:

- 1. an updated Maffeo Sutton Park Improvement Plan be developed in 2012;
- 2. that a planning process to guide the updated plan be presented at the October regular meeting of Commission for review and consideration; and,
- 3. that the amenity building capital project currently being planned for the park be put on-hold until an updated plan is developed and adopted.

It was moved and seconded that the recommendation be adopted. The motion carried unanimously.

### (c) Changing Face of Events & Festivals Elizabeth Williams, Manager, Recreation & Culture Services.

Ms. Williams provided an overview of the booking process, the type of events that are being held in our parks, and also specifically Maffeo Sutton Park, and the changes that are impacting the events from the traditional events of celebrating holidays and festivals to more cause-related events

It was noted by Commissioner Kipp that the City building department has an agent sign off form which may be suitable for use for paid event organizers.

It was moved and seconded that the presentation be received. The motion carried unanimously.

# (d) <u>Travel Assistance Grant - Nanaimo Blind Bowls.</u>

<u>Staff's Recommendation:</u> That the Parks, Recreation and Culture Commission recommend that Council approve the application for a Travel Assistance Grant for the Nanaimo Blind Bowls in the amount of \$200.00.

It was moved and seconded that the recommendation be adopted. The motion carried unanimously.

# (e) <u>Travel Assistance Grant – Nanaimo Diamonds Fastball.</u>

<u>Staff's Recommendation:</u> That the Parks, Recreation and Culture Commission recommend that Council approve the application for a Travel Assistance Grant for the Nanaimo Diamonds Fastball in the amount of \$800.00.

It was moved and seconded that the recommendation be adopted. The motion carried unanimously.

# (f) <u>Travel Assistance Grant – Nanaimo Diamonds Fastball – Bantam.</u>

<u>Staff's Recommendation:</u> That the Parks, Recreation and Culture Commission recommend that Council approve the application for a Travel Assistance Grant for the Nanaimo Diamonds Fastball – Bantam in the amount of \$1,000.00.

It was moved and seconded that the recommendation be adopted. The motion carried unanimously.
