1. CALL THE OPEN MEETING TO ORDER:

The Regular Meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

2. INTRODUCTION OF LATE ITEMS:

3. ADOPTION OF AGENDA:

It was moved and seconded that the Amended Agenda be adopted. The motion carried unanimously.

4. <u>ADOPTION OF MINUTES:</u>

(a) Minutes of the Regular Parks, Recreation and Culture Commission Meeting held Wednesday, 2011-APR-27, at 7:00 p.m., in the Bowen Park Complex Conference Room.

It was moved and seconded that the Minutes be adopted as circulated. The motion carried unanimously.

5. PRESENTATIONS:

(a) Presentation from Mel Sheng of DFO, Liz DeMattia of the Nanaimo Science and Sustainability Society (Ns³), and PRC staff on an update on the Bowen Park Side Channel and fish enhancement projects, Bowen Park Improvements, and the concept of a Family Science Centre at Bowen Park.

Mel Sheng, Dr. Bill Pennell, Sue Durnin, Dr. Liz DeMattia, and Pat Bugera, attended in support of the Family Science Centre at Bowen Park. Mel Sheng and Dr. Liz DeMattia spoke about the concept and the need in the mid-island for such a centre.

<u>Staff Recommendations</u>: That the Parks, Recreation and Culture Commission:

- support in principle the concept of a Science Centre at Bowen Park as presented by the Nanaimo Science and Sustainability Society (Ns³); and,
- that Staff work with the Nanaimo Science and Sustainability Society (Ns³) to work towards a feasibility plan for the Centre that would include a draft design, capital and operating requirements and sources of funding.

It was moved and seconded that the recommendations be adopted. The motion carried unanimously.

(b) Staff presentation on summer programs.

Damon Johnson and Pene Kellett provided a "snapshot" of the summer plans and details on the LIT/QUEST Program. "Memories in the Making!" is the theme for this year. Staff provided a handout, "Summer Fun Camps & Activities" outlining the various activities and locations available in the City for the summer.

6. <u>DELEGATIONS:</u>

It was moved and seconded that the Delegations be permitted to address the Commission. The motion carried unanimously.

(a) Ms. Nora Latam, 2540 Barnes Road, Nanaimo, B.C., V9X 1M7, presenting her concerns and suggestions regarding Concessionaire Services in Maffeo Sutton Park to the Parks, Recreation and Culture Commission.

Ms. Latam spoke with regard to food vendor availability and the minimal choices for food vendors in City parks. She wished to provide her perspective on being a parent with children in the park and trying to find food choices for her children. Ms. Latam spoke specifically with regard to concessions at the Empire Days Society and the confusion surrounding organizing of food vendors. Staff advised that as food vendors for events are organized by the group that books the park. The Empire Days Society does not book the Maffeo Sutton Park for the Empire Days events. Additionally, an explanation of park booking and the process that had occurred to select a concessionaire through RFP for Maffeo Sutton Park was detailed. Ms. Latam suggested that more than one vendor is required to ensure that easy access to refreshments is available. She suggested that the current vendor have a sign up sheet to sub-tender the available time periods to other vendors who would be able to utilize the space and provide the service in the absence of the regular vendor.

(b) Mr. Robin Thacker, Atlantis Kayaks, 2093 Cedar Road, Nanaimo, B.C., V9X 1J6, submitting proposals to operate kayak tours and rentals in Nanaimo's municipal parks to the Parks, Recreation and Culture Commission.

Mr. Thacker proposed two operations - first, a kayak tour facility to be operated out of Maffeo Sutton Park – providing kayaks and guides for organized tours, and, second, the provision of kayaks for rental out of Westwood Lake Park. No business licences have yet been obtained. Guides would belong to the Certified Kayaks Guide Alliance, have advanced wilderness first aid training, and have emergency contingency plans. They would like to work with the Harbour Commission in order to ensure that the proposed Maffeo Sutton Park tours are timed with air and sea traffic to ensure that there are no conflicts. They would like to start with between 5-10 Kayaks at Westwood Lake Park, and 15 in Maffeo Sutton Park. Kayaks would be transported to and from the second beach at Westwood and removed daily. The company is currently establishing a fee schedule. Maffeo Sutton Park has two possible sites one land-based, and one sea-based on the Newcastle Ferry Dock. They propose to build a 10X10 floating dock and kiosk preferably on the leeward side. This is BC Parks property and permission would be required from them. This is a multi-jurisdictional property. Liability insurance requirements would be from \$2M-\$5M.
