The Committee requested that Volunteer Nanaimo be asked whether they sought the funding mentioned in their 2010 Social Development grant application, and that all the organizations requested to submit a full application, be asked to indicate the "scaleability" of their proposal so that if the full amount requested cannot be provided, whether the proposed activity can be implemented on a smaller scale with a smaller budget.

It was also requested that the ad soliciting Letters of Intent for the 2012 Social Development grant program direct applicants to the program's guidelines on the City's website in order that they include a program budget.

When Letters of Intent are received for the 2012 Social Development grant program, staff will provide SPAC with the status reports received from organizations reapplying for funding.

#### 9. COMMITTEE UPDATES / COUNCIL UPDATE / INFO ITEMS

- a) PNAC No report.
- b) Grants Advisory Committee J. Neville advised that the Grants Committee did a review of their criteria. As organizations who receive City grants are not eligible for tax exemption, the Committee will review the permissive tax exemption list at their next meeting.
- c) Safer Nanaimo Working Group J. Horn reported that Safer are working on "shepherding' the affordable housing strategy through, and ensuring that proposals are distributed across the city. One neighbourhood where a building is being proposed is exhibiting anxiety, whereas another neighborhood that is farther along in

- the process is showing little concern as they become more experienced in addressing the issues.
- d) Nanaimo Working Group on Homelessness J. Neville advised that the Thanksgiving dinner put on by the NWGH was a phenomenal success.
- e) Council Update October 25 R. Meyerhoff reported that there were two presentations regarding the supportive housing project proposed for the hospital area. Residents were concerned about being overburdened with services in their area, and about the fact that the buildings would be "wet houses". Ralph encouraged SPAC to attend any future open houses on the planned supported housing projects.

SPAC voiced concern that if Council did not proceed with the projects, the homeless problem would only get worse. If the problem is addressed now, costs would be far less than if left to the future.

MOVED by V. Alcock-Carter, SECONDED by E. Forrester that SPAC send a letter to City Council encouraging Council to retain their stance regarding supportive housing projects planned for Nanaimo, and to not react to fear from a minority of the citizens of the city. CARRIED.

Suggestions were also made that staff should consult homeless strategy resource material from a few years ago about gaining community approval; and that Larry Campbell should be invited to speak to City Council.
