(a) Petition For Dog Off-Leash Area In North Nanaimo

<u>Staff Recommendation:</u> That the Parks Committee direction is sought following review of Item 8.(a) Staff Report "Potential Dog Off-Leash Parks In Nanaimo".

At their meeting of 2009-APR-22, the Parks, Recreation and Culture Commission received and reviewed correspondence from Ms. Marion Brom, 3562 Monterey Drive, Nanaimo, BC V9T 6T2, dated 2009-APR-14 to Chair Larry McNabb,

regarding a Petition for Dog Off-Leash Area in North Nanaimo (correspondence and petition attached). Presentation to the City of Nanaimo's Parks, Recreation and Culture Commission Wednesday, June 24th, 2009

Property-Acquisition - 1996 Jingle Pot Road:

Property owned by the Province of B.C. Transportation and Finance Authority
(File managed by Mike McGrenere - 250 387-8490

<u>Issue:</u> - The province is interested in selling this property

- We have been advised that the 'best' (easiest, quickest and cheapest) way to accomplish this is through direct sale to the City.
- To initiate this process, through a partnership similar to the acquisition made at 1960 Jingle Pot Road, we need to know what the price will be.
- Only when this information in available can the partnership proceed.

Request: In order to proceed we are asking the City, through the Parks Recreation and Culture Committee to undertake the necessary negotiations to determine a purchase price for this parcel.

Note: It is anticipated that after acquisition the partnership would then sell the front portion of this property, thereby recouping much of the purchase price and retaining the riparian portion for addition to the Buttertubs Marsh Conservation Area.

Regulation and Enforcement Issues - Buttertubs/Valley Oak Park

- The Buttertubs Wetland is a unique feature within Nanaimo, greatly appreciated by families, seniors and people who enjoy quiet interaction with nature.
- The City of Nanaimo is one of the signatories to the Buttertubs Marsh Conservation Area Management Plan
- Valley Oak Park is an important part of this wetland complex that is recognized as having similar values.

Request: We are asking the City of Nanaimo, Parks Recreation and Culture to implement means whereby activities deemed inappropriate in the Buttertubs Management Plan (domestic animals and bicycles in particular) can be regulated.

Note: For example, dogs are currently banned on school grounds, designated playing fields (Serauxmen), City beaches, (May 15 to Sept. 15) for public health reasons. At Buttertubs, where public access is limited to one perimeter trail, public health and conservation/education issues would appear to make this venue the least appropriate area for dog walking and cycling when there are a number of nearby facilities (Bowen Park, the Parkway Trail, Jingle Pot etc.)

At the 'end of the day' those who cherish this environment, & volunteers that contribute to its well being, need to feel this opportunity is not being jeopardised nor their efforts futile.

Buttertubs/Jingle Pot Marshes Liaison Committee

Who are we? - and - What do we do? A Briefing Note for Nanaimo City Council

We are an ad hoc, volunteer committee of the Nanaimo Field Naturalists Club (NFNC) that serves a stewardship role to ensure the viability of the Buttertubs and Jingle Pot wetlands.

Buttertubs Marsh Conservation Area: The BMCA is owned by The Nature Trust of British Columbia (TNTBC). It was purchased in 1975 and is managed by a partnership including TNTBC, the Provincial Ministry of the Environment, the City of Nanaimo and the NFNC.

Jingle Pot Wetlands: The Jingle Pot 3rd street property was purchased by the City of Nanaimo for the purpose of establishing baseball and soccer fields (partnered with Vancouver Island University) and an ice skating facility. About 60% has been dedicated to wetland conservation (headwaters of the Catstream) under the City's Parks, Recreation and Culture Dept.

What do we do?: In consultation with the property owners, we undertake works to improve these wetland habitats for vegetation and wildlife, and by providing appropriate community recreation/education opportunities in keeping with approved management plans.

At Buttertubs: We are working:

- To acquire, on a when and if basis, neighbouring lands to expand this wetland to its natural boundaries (map attached)
- To implement a new information/regulation signage program
- To better inform the public regarding BMCA regulations.

At Jingle Pot: We are working (with City staff):

- To delineate and demarcate with hedgerows the natural boundary between the playing fields and the wetland.
- To determine ways to stabilize low water retention levels behind flood water control structures to improve wetland habitat (for Virginia Rails)
- To ensure viable habitat remains for the Red Listed Vancouver Island Beggartick
- To ensure wildlife values are not unduly compromised by on site facilities such as the public corridor between Jingle Pot Road and Third Street

Where do we get our Funding? For property acquisitions at Buttertubs, in partnership with TNTBC & NALT, we received contributions from charitable foundations and public donations (\$50,000 to purchase the one acre at 1960 Jingle Pot road). Materials for on site works have been provided through public donation & purchase. TD Friends of the Environment Foundation, Nanaimo Chapter, & the City of Nanaimo, Dept. Parks Recreation & Culture have been particularly supportive.
