


Overview

Department's Share of City Budget





- Transportation
 - Major projects:
 - Northfield-Boundary, Terminal Ave, Georgia Greenway, Estevan, Cypress, plus others
 - Renewed 8 km of streets
 - 1.2 km new bike lanes
 - 650 m new sidewalks
 - Condition assessment on the entire road network
 - Phase I LED Street Light Conversion





2018 Achievements - Transportation





- Drinking Water
 - Major supply main duplication Dogwood Road to College Drive
 - Completed design stage for Emergency Water Pump Station
 - Managed and adapted to Nanaimo Lakes Wildfire
 - Updated Water Metering Strategy
 - Began implementation of Cross Connection Control Program










- Sanitary Sewer
 - Several improvements to reduce inflow
 - Protection Island upgrades
 - Shift to digital maintenance
 - Townsite Area sewer master plan
- Drainage
 - Creek realignment at Departure Creek (multiple departments)
 - Municipal Natural Asset Initiative a benchmark study across Canada,





- Solid Waste Management
 - Successful transition to automated waste collection to 28,000 homes, including insourcing recycling and collection of yard waste





- Capital Projects
 - 37 projects, valued at \$37 million complete or underway
 - 35 projects, valued at \$31 million being readied for 2019
 - Restructured approach to Project Management
 - Developed Project Management Framework



- Parking management
- Capacity to move forward with alternative transportation planning
- Ageing infrastructure water, sewer, roads and drainage.



- Growth! Operations and maintenance staff are at the same number as in the 1990's
- Capital Project implementation (volume) staff resources to manage and complete projects





- Access to Port Authority lands
- Sustainable funding for stormwater infrastructure
- Climate change adaptation sea level rise; more intense storms







- Ageing and unsound Public Works Facility
- Volume of capital projects are heavy routine renewal to new initiatives
- Cemetery management

- Cross Connection Control Program roll-out








2019 Key Initiatives

- Improvements to recycling efficiency and diversion




Draft Operating Budget - ENGPW

Excluding Sanitary Sewer and Waterworks






Draft Operating Budget – Sanitary Sewer

- New personnel:
 - Parking & Street Use Coordinator
 - Public Works Clerk/Dispatcher
- New garbage trucks and routes
- Implement Hospital Area Plan
- Sustainable Parking Grant program
- Cross Connection Control Grant program



Changes Not Included in Draft Budget

- New personnel:
 - Project Managers (2)
 - To keep up with increasing level of renewal projects and to reduce cost of external consultants
 - Asset Management Specialist
 - Improve risk evaluation for infrastructure renewals
 - Manager of Utilities
 - Reinstate overseeing operation of water, sanitary, storm functions



Changes Not Included in Draft Budget

- New personnel:
 - Active Transportation Coordinator
 - Implement sustainable vision of Transportation
 Master Plan
 - Traffic Signal Technician
 - To reduce reliance on contractor
 - Recycling Policy Advisor/Educator
 - To pursue public education and audits
