

SNIP- Spay Neuter Program - Funded by The City of Nanaimo

- \$25,000 grant for spay & neuter of owned cats with low income guardians
- 336 Cats were fixed through the program in 2017
- Over recent years the BC SPCA has seen a decline in surrendered kittens from Nanaimo, due to less unexpected litters







City of Nanaimo & SNIP



Request to Nanaimo City Council...

- \$25,000 to be spent over 2-3 years
- Council has previously supported grants of \$15,000-\$25,000 for this

program

This funding would provide:

- Approximately 150-350 spay and neuter surgeries per year
- The ability for lower income families to keep their pets, without having unwanted litters



BCSPCA SPEAKING FOR ANIMALS

Why Invest in Spay Neuter?



Kittens are cute but....

- Keeps unwanted animals out of shelters
- Prevents animal abandonment
- Helps protect wildlife
- Reduces risk of zoonotic disease spread
- Decrease bylaw complaints of nuisance cats

Public Service for Nanaimo

- Provides vet care access to seniors, low income folks and citizens of Nanaimo who are on disability
- Support local businesses
- Compassionate boarding spay/neuter
