1. <u>Update on Tourism Services in Nanaimo</u>

Karen Bannister, Executive Director, Tourism Nanaimo and Anthony Everett, President and CEO, Tourism Vancouver Island, provided a presentation regarding tourism in Nanaimo which included the following information:

- Engaged by City of Nanaimo in February 2017, two one-year contracts, currently on a five-year contract that began April 1, 2019
- Measuring tourism performance based on engagements and impressions
- Key successes including: collaboration on the formation of tourism round table, mountain biking campaign, website improvements, increase to the email subscriber list, move to data driven marketing initiatives and the Nanaimo ambassador program

L. Mercer entered the Boardroom at 3:08 p.m.

- Top challenges include: community engagement, resident pride, unified processes in business and sports tourism, brand awareness and technological impacts on visit servicing
- Developing a five-year strategic plan for tourism that includes: conversations with consumers, exceptional care, customer engagement, building community pride, remarkable experiences and community collaboration
- Learning partnership with Vancouver Island University
- Welcome committee for the Tourism Vancouver Island 56th Annual Conference and Annual General Meeting
- Working with the Nanaimo Port Authority to attract cruise ships

- Marketing partnership with Snuneymuxw First Nation for Saysutshun Island
- Key takeaways include: tourism economy is growing in BC, island dispersion presents an opportunity for Nanaimo, address priorities for development, improve resident pride and focus on off-season opportunities

OVERVIEW

Purpose of Report:

To provide Council with background information relating to the Downtown Nanaimo Information Session.

BACKGROUND

Downtown Nanaimo is the heart of the city. The downtown provides a variety of retail shops, a range of housing opportunities, professional offices and services, and the majority of cultural attractions in the city. The downtown is a transportation hub providing vital connections to Vancouver and neighbouring communities as well as being the focal point of the city's transit and road network. Along with a spectacular waterfront walkway and large civic park, the downtown serves as the community's gathering space for events and festivals. The downtown is the historical, cultural, professional, and business centre of Nanaimo.

The downtown core is also an area with a concentration of social services and has in recent years seen an increase in homelessness and social issues.

Downtown has been a focal point by previous Council's who have made investments in facilities and infrastructure. Development is encouraged through a number of policy documents, including the Official Community Plan, the Transportation Master Plan, and the Nanaimo Downtown Plan Urban Design Guidelines. Incentives such as the Hotel Revitalization Tax Exemption Program and the Downtown Revitalization Tax Exemption Program have been put in place to entice investment.

The 2019-2022 Strategic Plan recognizes the importance of downtown by prioritizing a number of initiatives, such as the Downtown Mobility Hub, investments at 1 Port Drive, and advocacy for the passenger ferry service to downtown Vancouver.

DISCUSSION

Staff have arranged a meeting of the Governance and Priorities Committee (GPC) to focus a discussion around the downtown core.

Attachment A contains a set of Poster Information Boards that outline current initiatives and projects that are underway in the downtown core.



During the GPC meeting, Council will be invited to explore the existing issues facing the downtown. Staff will be on hand to answer questions about current programs. The discussion will then focus on identifying priorities, actions, and opportunities for the downtown moving forward. The session will be graphically recorded, leaving a visual record for further discussion.

SUMMARY POINTS

- Downtown Nanaimo is the heart of the city, and contains residential, commercial, recreational, and cultural land uses. The downtown is also the transportation hub for the region.
- Previous Councils have set policy and made investments in the downtown core to encourage revitalization.
- Staff have provided a series of poster boards outlining the breadth of activity underway in the downtown core.
- Council has an opportunity during the GPC meeting to discuss issues, identify priorities, actions, and opportunities for downtown Nanaimo.


