The New Face of Homelessness...

- 12% of seniors live below the poverty line.
- Lack of affordable housing.
- More women over the age of 50 requiring emergency shelter and support at Samaritan House.
- And we have run out of room!



The need is desperate...

- Samaritan House is 100 years old - extremely outdated.
- Only has 14 emergency beds and 6 supported units.
- Overcrowded.
- Desperate need of upgrade and expansion.
- Over capacity on most nights.
- In August, women seeking shelter were turned away 111 times!
- Women have to find shelter in unsafe places.



Help us make room where there is none...

 Asking for an investment of \$100,000 from City of Nanaimo.

Total campaign \$2 Million.

 Renovate current Samaritan House and expand onto adjacent empty lot.



Expanding Samaritan House





This is what your investment will enable:

Better Spaces

Flexible bedrooms - shelter or supportive housing.

Environmental design – increase safety and improve appearance.

Reduce crowding – increase opportunities for learning.

Meeting rooms for health workers to meet privately with clients.

Better Care

Better storage to organize supplies, materials and resources.

Staff room – break from busy frontline facility.

Better Community

Positive environment for staff and clients.

Attractive outside appearance.

Campaign Timelines

Official launch April 2018 – construction commences.

April 2019 – construction completed.

- Active fundraising with government, public and private foundations.
- Meetings with local businesses and individual philanthropists.
- General public campaign commences spring 2018.
- Response so far has been amazing!
