#### **TONIGHT'S FORMAT**

Tonight's event is the first of four public engagement sessions that will be held over the course of the upcoming year. For this first session, we are using the *open space technology* method of engagement.

Citizens of Nanaimo have submitted a number of topics that they are interested in discussing and to facilitate these discussions in the most meaningful way, we will be starting tonight's session off by asking those in attendance to "vote" on which topics they would like to discuss. The top five topics will be the focus of conversations at the different stations around the room, along with a "wild card" table for those interested in an opportunity for broader conversations.

Each table will be facilitated and recorded by students of Vancouver Island University's Masters of Community Planning program. There will be three sessions of 20 minutes at each station, but individuals are welcome to move from table to table freely throughout the course of the evening.

At the conclusion of the evening, there will be a final wrap up where some of the key points from the discussions that occurred will be presented back to the group at large. We encourage you to get involved in the conversation and have your say, but please keep in mind the following:

- Do not dominate the conversation take turns, and allow the opportunity for all of those around the table to speak.
- Do not interrupt please be respectful of others at the table and allow the speaker to finish talking before offering your comments.
- Be respectful remember that although someone else's opinion may differ from yours, this is an opportunity to hear from all sides of the conversation so we encourage everyone to keep an open mind and treat all participants with the same respect that you would wish to be given.
- Council is here to listen and participate members of Council are in attendance but please bear in mind that this is not the forum to be directing them to answer questions; rather, this is an opportunity to engage with them as fellow members of the community and share and discuss with them your views on the topics that matter to you.
