Feedback submitted via email:

For me, communication should enable two parties (Council/Staff and the public) the opportunity to share and exchange information/ideas/concerns in a respectful manner.

To be successful some level of structure/protocal is essential.

The following is submitted for consideration:

The "meeting" should be issue/subject driven and the subject(s) of a particular meeting should be published in advance to enable research and preparation.

Council/Staff should publish in advance a subject or two that they wish to provide information on the "what - why - and how" of the issue. The public should also submit issues of concern in advance also with "what - why - and how" for Council knowledge/consideration/preparation.

In addition, an open question period should be available near the end. Questions that cannot be answered "on the fly" should or could be answered on a city site set up for that purpose. Alternatively, the question could form part of the next public meeting for discussion.

As to the form of the engagement, it may be that "one size" doesn't fit all and depending on the issues to be discussed one form may be more effective/suitable than another. In other words it may be prudent not to lock yourself into any one specific option.
