


The Canada Learning Bond

Up to \$2,000 of grants into Registered Education Savings Plan of eligible children.

Eligibility

- children born in 2004 or later
- who are living in families whose combined household income is less than \$45,000 per year.





Elements of the CLB

- first payment is \$500 and an additional \$100 is deposited every year thereafter that the family remains eligible (to a \$2,000 max)
- retroactive
- "Get It and Forget It"
- no parental contribution is required





How the CLB helps

A child living in a low income family with as little as \$500 saved in an education savings account, is more than four times more likely to enroll in a post secondary institution than a child with no savings account.





BC Training and Education Savings Grant (BCTESG)

- introduced in August 2016
- Provides a one-time payment of \$1,200 into the RESP of an eligible child



Eligibility


- Children born in 2006 or later
- Both parent and child must be residents of BC
- The child must have an RESP


Child Poverty!!!

City of Nanaimo



That equates to approximately \$8,000,000 in unpaid federal grant money for children living in low income families in Nanaimo.





Progress

2012 Uptake Rate

24%

2016 Uptake Rate

34%

That translates into a \$1.9 million dollar investment of federal funds for Nanaimo children most at risk*.

^{*}Nanaimo has **1661** more children living in low income families than it did in 2012.
