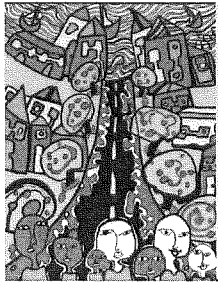

Dear Advisory Committee on Environmental Sustainability,

I am writing on behalf of the South End Community Association to express our support for the proposed Voluntary Idling Bylaw to come into effect for the City of Nanaimo. At our October 7th general meeting a unanimous motion for this proposal displayed the support for improved relations between our industrial neighbours. With industrial operations scattered throughout our South End neighbourhood we have daily examples of large distribution vehicles adjacent to residential homes and we've heard from our neighbours that vehicle idling continues to occur in exorbitant amounts and outside of regular business hours. This proposed bylaw and enforcement of idling restrictions would benefit all of Nanaimo citizens' health and environmental conditions, both of which are in line with the emission reduction targets of PlanNanaimo and the mixed-use industrial and residential relationship improvements outlined in The South End Neighbourhood Plan.

We very much hope that your committee and Council will explore this issue further and know that they have the full support of this association in doing so.

DETAILS OF PRESENTATION:

The CC-Visages project in Canada seeks to understand the range of perspectives in regard to how individuals understand, communicate about, and work to shape climate change policy in Canada. The project is funded by the University Alliance for Sustainability between the Free University of Berlin, and University of British Columbia. The main focus of this study is perceptions of climate change and of effective mitigation and adaptation studies at the municipal level. The goal is to examine the range of consensus and discourses in regard to action on climate change (whether adaptation or mitigation) and compare this to the greater policy framework in Canada.
