Dear Advisory Committee on Environmental Sustainability,

I am writing on behalf of the South End Community Association to express our support for the proposed Voluntary Idling Bylaw to come into effect for the City of Nanaimo. At our October 7th general meeting a unanimous motion for this proposal displayed the support for improved relations between our industrial neighbours.
