


Parker & Matilda Williams

- In 2014 the wonderful collaboration with Tourism Nanaimo began to staff the Bastion throughout the summer as a satellite visitor center.





Nanaimo Museum School Programs 2014/15

First Nations for Primary

(Grade K-3) Sept. to Nov. & Jan. to June

Available at the museum or in your classroom

Even your kindergarten students will be engaged!
Explore traditional Snuneymuxw culture through handson activities that were designed for primary students.
See how tools were made and used to create homes,
ceremonial art and catch food. The weaving component
of the program includes a chance for each student to try
out their own mini-loom.

A Child's Life in Nanaimo

(Grade 2/3) Sept. to Nov. & Jan. to June

Experience what life was like for children 100 years ago. Students will visit the miner's cottage to see the type of home a typical family lived in and their daily routine of chores. Take a seat in wooden desks complete with ink wells and participate in a lesson with the strict teacher. Make jam from scratch just like families used to and play with toys that were popular in the early 1900s.

Navigating History

(Grade 4-7) Sept. to Nov. & Jan. to June (\$60)

Step into Nanaimo's past while on a GPS-based scavenger hunt through the downtown core. Groups of students will navigate to a series of heritage signs using GPS receivers. Each sign contains intriguing historical facts and the answer to scavenger hunt questions.

Yesteryear Christmas

(Grade K-3) December 1 - 18, 2014

Journey back through time and experience Christmas traditions from 100 years ago. Visit the miner's cottage to see a tree decorated with candles, play with toys from the early 1900s and make a Christmas tree ornament to take home. Students will also enjoy festive goodles.









Nanaimo Museum School Programs 2014/15

First Nations on Vancouver Island

(Grade 4) Sept. to Nov. & Jan. to June

Available at the museum or in your classroom

The museum's knowledgeable tour guides and hands-on artifact collection can provide the ideal complement to your classroom First Nations curriculum. Students will discover the connections between traditional First Nations cultures on Vancouver Island, examine a variety of tools, and get a glimpse into daily life in Snuneymuxx willages.

A Coal Miner's Family

(Grade 5) Sept. to Nov. & Jan. to June

Visit the miner's cottage to see the type of home a typical family lived in 100 years ago. Students will put on coal miner's lamps for a guided tour of the re-created mine and learn about the challenges faced by miners. This program provides a unique opportunity to see life from the different perspectives of a coal miner and his children.

The Bastion

(Grade 3-5) September

Discover Nanaimo's oldest existing building! Learn why the Bastion was built, who helped with its construction and the importance of immigration to Nanaimo in the 1850s. The tour is guided but leaves time for exploration with Discovery Sheets.

Bastion Bonus

(Grade 2/3/5) September (\$20.00)

Explore Nanaimo's most recognizable landmark during a 45 minute tour. Your students will participate in a guided tour of the Bastion's three floors with additional time to check out the artifacts and exhibits on their own.










Visitors/FTE Staff Comparison



Volunteer Investment

- Although volunteer hours were not official recorded in the early years, a safe estimate is an average of what we did record in the first 5 years of tracking. Using this formula, volunteers have contributed approximately 150,000 hours or a dollar investment of 1.5M!!
- From 1992 through 2013 volunteer hours total 91,466 hours
- How would the museum ever have survived without this valuable investment??






Hub City


The last major permanent gallery section addition







