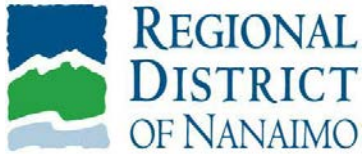

This letter is to inform you that the City of Nanaimo's Regional Context Statement is due for review in 2019.

The City of Nanaimo's Regional Context Statement was last approved on October 22, 2013. In accordance with section 448(c) of the *Local Government Act*, a review of a Regional Context Statement is to take place at least once every five years after its latest acceptance by the Regional District of Nanaimo Board. If no amendment is proposed the Regional Context Statement is submitted to the Board for its continued acceptance.

The Regional Context Statement identifies how the City's Official Community Plan is consistent with, and will work towards achieving the goals and strategies set out in the RDN's [Regional Growth Strategy](#). If the City's Official Community Plan is not consistent with the Regional Growth Strategy, then the City's Regional Context Statement must explain how their Official Community Plan will become consistent with the Regional Growth Strategy over time.

To assist in satisfying this requirement, please confirm in writing if any change(s) to the City's Regional Context Statement are required since last accepted. Once received the RDN Board will indicate whether or not the City's Regional Context Statement is accepted.
