Thank you again for securing the Serauxman Stadium and allowing us this opportunity. We are writing to confirm the formation of the Serauxmen Stadium Amateur Baseball Association (SSADA) in cooperation with the stadium's user groups and volunteers. The goal of the new Association is to develop plans in a partnership with the City of Nanaimo's Parks and Recreation department for the operation and improvements of the facilities at the Stadium. This new relationship transfers the operational responsibility of the Stadium from Nanaimo Minor Baseball to SSADA and the City.

Minor Baseball in Nanaimo has a long, rich history of providing a sport where kids and young adults can dream of opportunities that can shape their lives forever.

Within the Nanaimo Baseball system, there are teams and programs that offer something for everyone. These programs are designed for ages ranging from 5 to 65. The success stories are endless.
