

Corporation of the City of Nanaimo B.C.

A Bylaw relating to Fire Insurance Companies.

Whereas it is deemed expedient to impose a tax upon Fire Insurance Companies carrying on business within the limits of the City of Nanaimo.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the City of Nanaimo:—

1. There shall be levied and collected upon and from each and every Fire Insurance Company carrying on business within the limits of the City of Nanaimo, the sum of one hundred dollars, such sum to be due and payable on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of August, during the present year, and after the present year, the said amount of one hundred dollars shall be due and payable and shall continue thenceforth to be made on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of January of each year.

2. Every such payment shall be made when due as aforesaid, by every such Fire Insurance Company, to the collector for the time being of the Municipality of the Corporation of the said City of Nanaimo, at his office, at the Council Chambers, in the

- the said City of Nanaimo.
3. In the event of any Fire Insurance Company refusing or neglecting to pay such tax when due as aforesaid, the same together with interest and costs, shall be recoverable by action, as a debt due to the said Municipality.
  4. This Bylaw may be cited for all purposes as the "Fire Insurance Companies' Tax Bylaw, 1897."
