## THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF NANAIMO BY-LAW NO. 701

A BY LAW TO BRING DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME INTO EFFECT WITHIN THE CITY OF NANAIMO

WHEREAS an emergency exists in this Municipality due to the confusion caused by the adoption of Daylight Saving

Time by other municipalities and by transportation companies whose interests interlock with the interests of enterprise in this Municipality; and

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient for the sake of uniformity and for the comfort and convenience of the residents of this Municipality to adopt Daylight Saving Time.

THEREFORE the Municipal Council of The Corporation of the City of Nanaimo, pursuant to the provisions of Section 178 A of the "Municipal Act" enacts as follows:

- 1. It is hereby declared that an emergency exists in this Municipality due to the confusion caused as aforesaid.
- 2. That as of and from 12 o'clock midnight of the day this By-Law is approved by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, time within the Corporate Limits of this City shall be seven hours behind Greenwich time and shall so continue until midnight of Saturday, September 28th, 1946, when time within the said limits shall revert to eight hours behind Greenwich time.
- 3. This By-Law may be cited as the "DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME BY-LAW, 1946".
