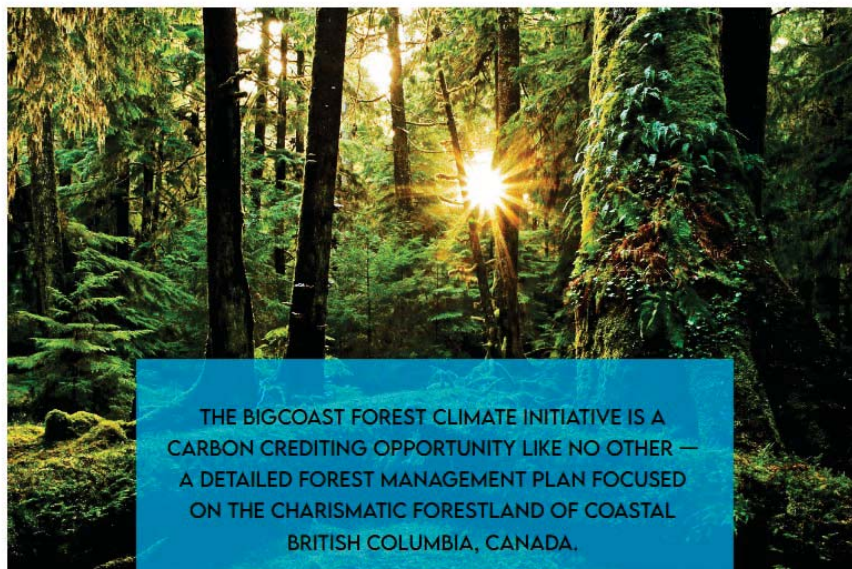

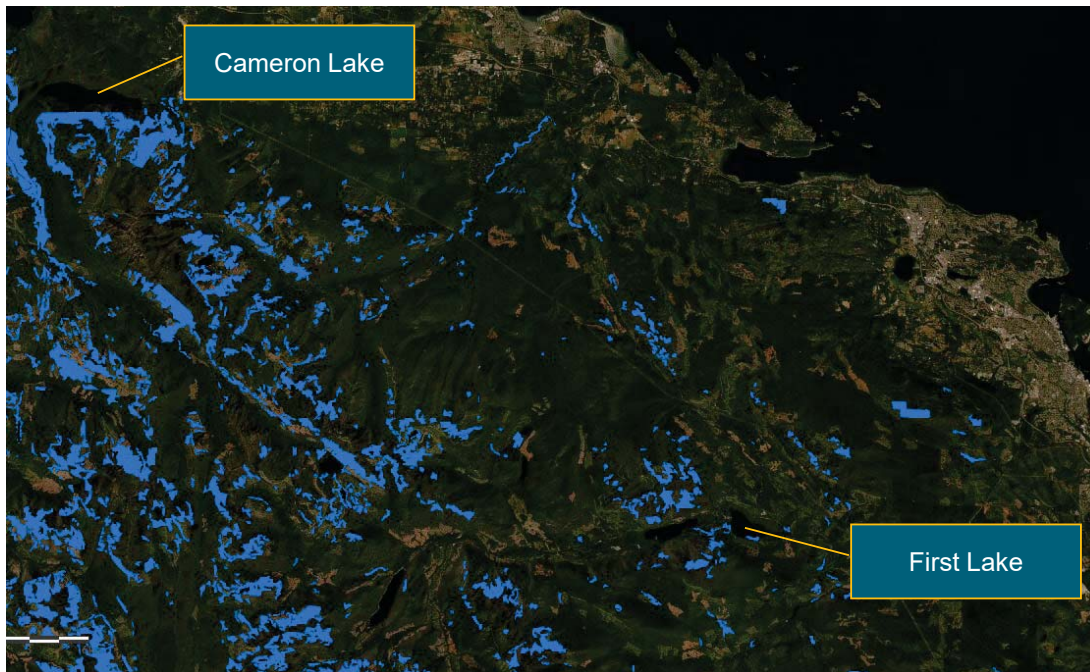

Mt Benson & Westwood Lake Parks

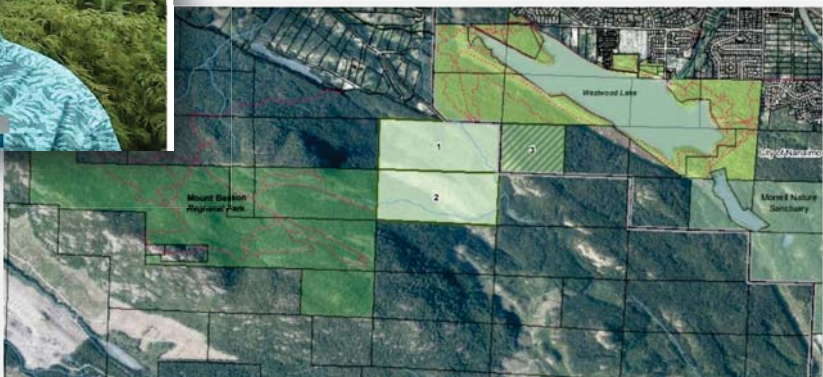

Mosaic Forest Management and Community Partners to Mark Earth Day with Cleanup Events

APRIL 21, 2022

Nanaimo, BC – Community volunteers and partners will join Mosaic Forest Management in marking the 52nd anniversary of Earth Day with a series of cleanup events on Mosaic and adjacent forest lands across Vancouver Island.

The Earth Day 2022 theme is "Restore in Our Planet", and that's what hardworking volunteers are doing today by participating in local cleanup efforts targeting the problem of illegal dumping.

"Illegal dumping on Mosaic lands significantly impacts forest health and our diverse opportunities as our private forest lands," said Mosaic Director of Sustainability, who volunteers who show their support for clean outdoor spaces on Earth Day and beyond.

Even though most visitors value their access to the forests and respect the private significant problem, it costs Mosaic close to \$100,000 every year to remove illegal materials, money that could be better spent on expanding recreational activities and restoring our forests in illegal dumping sites in 2021 compared to 2020 into communities.

"Each year, Earth Day cleanup efforts grow as more people get involved to combat our forests," says Stephanie Hildreth with the Central Valley Regional Office. "This is not a cumulative effect and makes a big difference."
