OVERVIEW OF YOUR ORGANIZATION'S PROGRAMS AND SERVICES OFFERED IN THE COMMUNITY:

We are a 100% volunteer-based cat rescue since 1998 who responds to public calls for assistance with stray and abandoned semi-feral and feral cats. We trap them humanely, arrange appropriate veterinary care, and spay/neuter to prevent future unwanted litters and potential abandonment.

For adoptable cats, we have a network of foster homes who care for and socialize them until they are ready for adoption – CatNap supplies all food, litter, supplies and medications during foster care.

For feral cats, they are returned to their original colony location following sterilization (i.e TNR – trapneuter-release) where there is a caregiver who provides food, water, shelter for them. If a feral cat is unable to be returned to the original trapping location, we seek out relocation opportunity with approved barn/acreage locations if care, food and shelter will be provided by the property owner.

We also receive many calls from citizens looking for help or advice e.g. with trapping their lost cat.

1. Please describe the Purpose or Mandate of your organization in this community.

- Our charity mandate and purpose has been for 22 years, to address the needless suffering of cats who have through no fault of their own, been left to fend for themselves in our community.

We rescue unwanted stray and abandoned semi-feral and feral cats, help them receive appropriate veterinary care for spay/neuter, and diagnosis/treatment for infections, parasite burden, and injuries, socialize them in foster care, and adopt them to loving homes whenever possible. Feral cats deemed unadoptable, are returned to their primary trapping location with a caregiver to provide food/water/shelter or relocated through our Barn/acreage home program.

2. Please list the programs and services provided by your organization.

- Cat rescue receive calls from public to assist, respond/trapping of unowned animals
- Provision of veterinary care for all rescued cats including spay/neuter
- Adoption of rescued animals following medical treatment(s) direct from CatNap and via community adoption partners
- Return of trapped feral cats to colony following sterilization with assigned caregiver to provide food, water, shelter
- Relocation of healthy, sterilized feral cats to barn homes (if can't be returned to colony)
- Will assist in trapping owned cats if volunteer resources permit
- Will accept unwanted, owned kittens from public if foster space permits and if SPCA is unable to assist due to space limitations

4. Please describe the role of volunteers in your organization.

- Executive Director oversees CatNap operations; provides leadership, creates growth and improvement for CatNap, liaises with Vet Clinics, SPCA, Nanaimo Animal Control, other cat rescue societies, etc. as required
- Rescue/Trapping Director direct rescue of cats/trapping work; liaising with public on projects
- Foster Director prepares new foster home volunteers for their role, orientation, paperwork, provides supplies
- Foster Coordinators long-term senior foster homes who oversee a number of foster homes under them provide mentorship, arrange vet care for their foster cats.
- Foster homes caring for cats until veterinary care complete; socialization of shy/scared/semi-feral cats until adoption-ready
- Adoption Director plans adoption events and profiling of personality information for each adoptable posting; liaises with adoption partners for placement, posts on social media
- Treasurer receipt of income, payment of expenses, bookkeeping, tax filings, grant applications, management of online donation platforms, financial reporting, etc.
- Secretary- issues volunteer communication, prepares meeting agendas/minutes

Volunteer roles Cont'd:

- Volunteer Director interviews/processes paperwork for new volunteers; assigns them to person overseeing their area(s) of interest for volunteering
- Delivery/pick up of cats for veterinary appointments
- Feeding/socializing of cats at foster intake location daily until foster home space available; cleaning/disinfection of this holding space daily
- Collection of food/litter/supply donations
- Pickup/delivery of food/litter/supplies/medications for foster homes
- Email and Social media responses to incoming messages from public
- Maintaining/posting on social media platforms and website management
- Liaising with other rescues to collaborate on projects
- Feeding/care of feral cats/colonies
- Fundraising
- Processing of adoption applications for pet insurance trial registration; tattoo/microchip transfers
- Document management adoption resources for new owners, policy/procedure documents, handbooks, volunteer agreements

We charge no fees for 'service' i.e. trapping assistance or barn cat relocations, but we suggest the caller make a financial donation to CatNap. The main sources of revenue for us are our adoption fees, fundraising and donations made by 'cat-loving' supporters of the rescue work we do.

 Adoption fees – fees for adoptable cats are based on the average cost of spay/neuters for all vet provider partners, and the standard pre-adoption treatment costs for tattoo or microchip, primary and booster vaccines, two deworming medications and two defleaing medications.

Cats <1yr of age - \$325 Cats 1-8 yrs of age - \$250 Cats >8 yrs - \$150

These fees do not compensate for the diagnosis/treatment of complex medical needs required for many of our rescued cats including antibiotics, x-rays, bloodwork, emergency care, surgeries, dental care, etc.

CatNap Society is very grateful to have been recommended by the City of Nanaimo to be included as a stakeholder in the 2020 animal control bylaws service review with Neilson Strategies/Consultants. We were pleased to see that one of the recommendations Mr. Neilson put forward in his review, is that the City provide an annual 'grant-in-kind' to CatNap in order to support and sustain the charity's rescue work in serving the Nanaimo community and its citizens.

We have not previously sought financial support from the City over the past 22 years, and have estimated to have assisted in the rescue and care of 5,000+ community cats during this time. We would be very appreciative of city funding in order to ensure we can continue our work to control the population of community cats and respond to requests for assistance from the public.

We normally rescue between 400-500 cats each year – for 2020 calendar year to date, we have already rescued 559.

Note: We also received an exceptional personal donation from a member of the public/supporter this year, in the amount of \$10,000. Had we not received that donation, our revenue would be much closer to our expected year end expenses.
