Aging Playground Infrastructure

- 22 neighbourhood playgrounds are more than 25 years or older. Estimated \$2.5M renewal cost. Backlogged renewals increase potential safety issues and lead to removal of play equipment.

Natural Area Parkland

- Over 900 hectares of, limited Urban Forestry resources are stretched and largely dealing with tree risk management. This results in less ability to grow and develop canopy in new areas including restoration of disturbed sites and planting new street trees.

- Challenges facing Public Safety in parks, public spaces, and public facilities resulting in delayed maintenance work order completion in the Facility and Parks Operations section with staff being less able to conduct preventative maintenance. 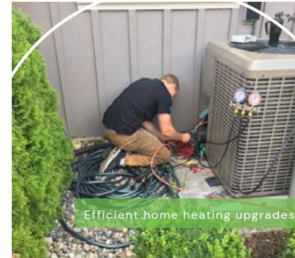

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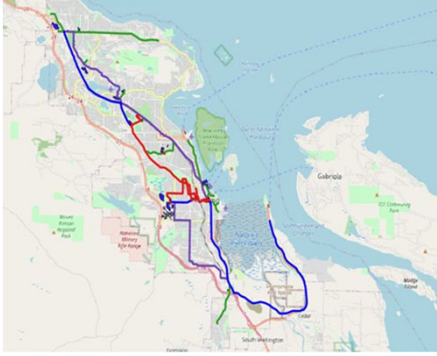
