## Situation Table

Is an interdisciplinary team with members drawn from the community, including front line staff working in policing, health, child welfare, mental health and addictions, housing, bylaw, outreach, and other social services. Situation Table participants receive training on the framework and approaches used by the Situation Table.

Supports offered by a Situation Table framework allows individuals and families to be connected quickly to social and safety services, usually within 24-48 hours. By responding to critical and urgent circumstances, a Situation Table improves not only the life of an individual in crisis but also positively affects public safety, providing a level of protection when persons who are referred to the table draw heavily on multiple resources and/or become challenging to local businesses and the community.

## RCMP CRISIS CAR 54

The Car 54 program is a partnership between the Nanaimo RCMP and Island Health, created to provide a thoughtful and coordinated response for people experiencing a mental health crisis in the City of Nanaimo. Car 54 is comprised of a Mental Health Liaison Officer (MHLO) and an experienced RCMP Liaison Nurse.
