B.C.'s Worst Aviation Disaster Kills 23 Workers

After dark on 17 October 1951, in fog and driving rain, all 23 people on board a converted RCAF Canso A bomber were killed when it smashed into the north face of Mount Benson (Te'tuxwtun), eight kilometres west of Nanaimo. In addition to the flight crew, the aircraft was carrying construction workers from the Aluminum Company of Canada (ALCAN) hydro dam and smelter project in Kitimat to their homes in and near Vancouver. Remains and personal effects, including union membership applications, were scattered around the wreckage. The remains of 12 victims are interred in a mass grave on this spot. At the time, it was the worst aviation disaster in B.C. history and the second worst in Canadian history.
