### **Supportive Housing Overview**

### **Typical Supports and Services**

- Studio apartment or single sleeping unit
- Staff onsite 24/7
- · Daily meals
- Storage, laundry, washroom and shower facilities
- Life skills training
- Access to culturally informed supports
- · Referrals to health care and community supports

#### **Residents**

- Adults (19 +) of all genders including seniors and people with disabilities.
- Experiencing or at risk of homelessness
- In need of supports to maintain housing
- All residents pay rent

### **Supportive Housing Registry**

345 applicant households in Nanaimo as of March 31, 2025

#### Of these:

- 30% identify as Indigenous
- 28% are over the age 55
- 70% reported substance use issues
- 75% reported a mental health condition
- 32% reported having stayed at a shelter in the past
